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COUNCIL MINUTES

November 23, 2020

Due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic, the Florissant City Council met in a virtual meeting through a Zoom platform on Monday, November 23, 2020 at 7:30 p.m. with Council President Schildroth presiding. The Chair asked everyone in attendance to stand and join in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

On Roll Call the following Councilmembers were present: Siam, Harris, Manganelli, Eagan, Caputa, Schildroth, Mulcahy, Pagano and Parson. Also present was Mayor Timothy Lowery, City Clerk Karen Goodwin, and City Attorney John Hessel. A quorum being present the Chair stated that the Council Meeting was in session for the transaction of business.

The City Attorney explained that the meeting was being conducted remotely because of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic emergency. He stated that under the Sunshine Law, Section 610.015, when an emergency existed, the members of the City Council who are not physically present in the Council Chambers, can participate and vote remotely on all matters.

Councilwoman Pagano moved to approve the City Council Minutes of November 9, 2020 and Budget Meeting Minutes of November 4, 2020, seconded by Caputa. Motion carried.

Councilman Schildroth moved to amend the agenda to move Resolution No. 1020 to the next item on the agenda, seconded by Eagan. Motion carried.

Council as a whole introduced <u>Resolution No. 1020 of the Florissant City Council and Mayor honoring Anita Moore for her 26 years of service, including 22 years as the Deputy City Clerk of the City of Florissant and said Resolution was read for the first time. - 56 program and thanked the officers for their efforts in the community. Council President Schildroth read
- 57 the names of the SRO officers recognizing them for their excellent service.

- Donna Smith-Pupillo, 1275 Swan stated that she celebrates the community becoming more
- diverse. She encouraged the appointments to the Citizen Review Board to reflect that diversity.
- Monique Davenport, 3565 Parc Chateau Lane, she questioned the number of members being 7
- and asked how all of the wards would be represented.

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63 Josh Privitt, 456 Georgia Avenue, encouraged the council to make sure the CRB Committee is 64 diverse. 65 The next item on the Agenda was Communications. Email dated November 19, 2020 from Marvin Tobias regarding the Cares Act Funding. 66 67 68 The next item on the Agenda was *Public Hearings* of which there were none. 69 The Chair stated that the next item on the agenda was Second Readings. 70 Councilman Eagan moved that Bill No. 9639 an Ordinance adopting the budget for the City of 71 Florissant for the fiscal year commencing on December 1, 2020 and ending on November 30, 2021 and 72 providing for its effective date be read for a second time, seconded by Schildroth. Councilman Eagan 73 mentioned that there was considerable discussion about North County Incorporated in the budget 74 discussions and hopes that next year this is not the same discussion. Councilman Manganelli expressed 75 his support for North County Incorporated. Councilman Harris express his support for North County 76 Incorporated. Motion carried and Bill No. 9639 was read for a second time. Councilwoman Pagano 77 moved that Bill No. 9639 be read for a third time, seconded by Caputa. WHEREAS:

Lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer death among men and women in the United States and in Missouri in 2020, accounting for more deaths than colon cancer, breast cancer, and prostate cancer combined, and

WHEREAS:

The 5-year survival rate for localized lung cancer is ~59%, yet only ~17% of lung cancers are diagnosed at this stage, and

WHEREAS:

Screening for lung cancer for high-risk individuals using low-dose computed tomography can lead to the earlier detection of lung cancer and save lives, reducing the mortality by 20% when compared to screening by chest x-ray in the National Lung Screening Trial and reducing the risk of death at 10 years by 24% in men and 33% in women as demonstrated by another large randomized trial, and

WHEREAS:

Funding for lung cancer research trails far behind funding for research of many other cancers, and additional research is needed in early diagnosis, screening, and treatment for lung cancer as well as in lung cancer affecting women and lung cancer health disparities, and

WHEREAS:

Women diagnosed with lung cancer are more likely to be younger and neversmokers, lung cancer incidence and mortality rates in women are rising relative to men, more women die from lung cancer than breast cancer every year and by 2035, it is expected that more women will die from lung cancer than men, and

WHEREAS:

Organizations working in the Florissant community, such as the American Lung Cancer Screening Initiative and Women's Lung Cancer Forum, are committed to educating about lung cancer and lung cancer screening and working to increase lung cancer screening rates in Florissant.

NOW, THEREFORE, I Timothy J. Lowery, Mayor of the City of Florissant, MO and members of the Florissant City Council do hereby proclaim November as Lung Cancer Awareness Month in Florissant, and recognize the need for research in lung cancer affecting women and lung cancer health disparities, and encourage all citizens, to learn about lung cancer and early detection through lung cancer screening.

CITY OF FLORISSANT SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT TO THE FY 2019 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN TO ADD COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLACK GRANT – CORONAVIRUS (CDBG-CV) FUNDS

SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT TO THE FY 2019 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN TO ADD COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLACK GRANT – CORONAVIRUS (CDBG-CV) FUNDS

On March 27, 2020, the United States Congress passed The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (H.R. 748; CARES Act). The bill provided \$5 billion for CDBG to rapidly respond to COVID – 19 and the economic and housing impacts caused by it.

Per the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), the City of Florissant, MO's CDBG-CV first round allocation is \$151,584 with a third round allocation of 242,112 for a cumulative amount of all allocations rounds of \$393,696. A Substantial Amendment to the FY2019 Annual Action Plan is required to receive CDBG-CV funding, and while HUD usually requires a thirty (30) day public comment period, in the interest of getting funding to Entitlement Communities swiftly and expediantly, they have waived this requirement to allow a public comment period of no less than five (5) days.

The CDBG-CV funds allocated under the CARES Act must be used for a range of eligible activities that prepare for, prevent, and/or respond to COVID-19. The proposed activities must meet at least one of the three National Objectives required by CDBG regulations:

- Benefit low-to-moderate income persons.
- Aid in the prevention or elimiation of slumbs or blight, and
- Meet and urgent need.

The City of Florissant is recommending to allocate the funds as follows:

In addition to and for the purpose of an expedited use of the CDBG-CV funding, the bill eliminates the cap on the amount of funds a grantee can spend on public services, removes the requirement to hold in-person hearings in order to comply with national and local social gathering requirements, and allows grantees to be reimbursed for COVD-19 response activities regardless of the date the costs were incurred.

Public Review

Pursuant to HUD regulations, the City of Florissant's Citizen Participation Plan and current HUD waivers for grant programs and consolidated plan requirements to prevent the spread of COVID-19, staff published a 5-day comment period and public hearing. Public comments and Council allocation recommendations will be included in the Substantial Amendment to the FY 2019 Annual Action Plan.

Specifications:

FY 2019

The City of Florissant will re-allocate \$104,703 from its FY 2019 CDBG Home Improvement Program to provide much needed funding for activities where current funding has been depleted.

Housing Programs:

Home Improvement Program - Mechanical: Assist qualified Florissant residents with the repair/replacement of HVAC units and/or Water Heaters. With the addition of the CARES Act funding, the regular entitlement allocation for FY2020 has been delayed. All existing funds for this program have been expended. The reallocation of funds will allow the program to serve additional residents until the FY 2020 funds are made available.

Project I.M.P.A.C.T.: Assist qualified Florissant residents with the construction of wheelchair ramps, purchase materials and supplies for homes being repaired by volunteer groups, and to help with dumpsters in situations where our residents could be displaced from their homes due to health and safety issues. With the addition of the

CARES Act funding, the regular entitlement allocation for FY2020 has been delayed. All existing funds for this program have been expended. The reallocation of funds will allow the program to serve additional residents until the FY 2020 funds are made available.

Administration: Utilize the CDBG 20% administrative and planning cap to effectively administer CDBG funding to properly and swiftly meet the needs of Florissant residents.

Public Services:

Mortgage, Rent & Utility Assistance:

Expansion of the City of Florissant's CDBG MRU Assist Program to provide financial assistance for household rent, mortgage or utility assistance up to six months to reduce foreclosures, evictions, utility shutoffs, and to prevent dislocation and homelessness due to the increased need and demand due to the impact of COVID-19. CAASTLC currently holds the FY2019 CDBG MRU Assist contract.

Food Bank & Coordinated Entry Program:

To aid with food & supply relief as well as financial support for COVID related expenses and a Coordinated Entry Program to increase the Program's capacity to serve City residents with basic needs due to increased demand due to the impact of COVID-19.

Mobile COVID Testing Clinic Assistance:

To provide income eligible City of Florissant residents with COVID testing in the effort to prepare for, prevent and/or respond to COVID-19.

Housing Programs:

Home Improvement Program - CV:

Assist qualified Florissant residents with home repair who have experienced financial loss directly related due to COVID. Funding is designed to assist with the increased need and demand due to the impact of COVID-19.

Administration:

Utilize the CDBG-CV 20% administrative and planning cap to effectively administer CDBG-CV funding to properly and swiftly meet the needs of Florissant residents.

Police officer means a commissioned law enforcement officer, other than the chief of police, who has the power of arrest and who serves in the Florissant Police Department.

C. Establishment; membership; qualifications; terms; and removal.

- (1) The Citizens Police Review Board is hereby established.
- (2) The Board shall consist of seven (7) members appointed by the city council upon recommendation of the Mayor. Members shall serve without compensation.
 - (3) . The City shall actively notify citizens to apply for appointment to the Board, and City Council members and citizens are encouraged to make recommendations to the Mayor about persons who should be considered for appointment to the Board based upon their independent, impartial, balanced views.
 - (4) At least five (5) of the Board members must be registered voters and either a resident of Florissant, or an owner of a business in Florissant, or a leader of a church or religious congregation in Florissant. Board members may not be employed by the city; have served in a law enforcement capacity in the past five (5) years; be a party to any pending litigation against the city, excluding traffic offenses; be a current elected public office holder; or have served as an elected public office holder in the past five (5) years; or be a candidate for elected public office; and the spouses of the foregoing persons. Board members should reflect the cultural and racial diversity of Florissant and demonstrate knowledge of issues pertaining to civil rights and the criminal justice system and police practices. Board members cannot have a serious criminal record. The Police Chief shall obtain a criminal history of all applicants for membership on the Board and advise the city council of any arrests and any convictions for violations of federal, state or local law.
 - (5) Three (3) of the members first appointed by the city council shall serve terms of two (2) years, two (2) shall serve terms of three (3) years and two (2) shall serve terms of four (4) years. Thereafter, members appointed by the city council shall serve terms of three (3) years. Vacancies shall be filled for unexpired terms in the same manner as the original appointments.
 - (6) The Board or the Mayor may recommend to the city council that a Board member be removed from the Board if the member persistently fails to perform the duties of office or has engaged in conduct that is detrimental to the City or the Board.

78 (7) No Board member may serve more than two (2) consecutive terms.

79 D. Officers; meetings; quorum; rules.

- (1) The Board shall elect a chair and vice-chair from among its members. The term of these officers shall be one (1) year. The chair shall preside at meetings. The vice-chair shall preside when the chair is absent or otherwise unable to preside.
 - (2) The Board should meet at least monthly, and should meet as frequently as possible to perform its duties. When requested by the Board the Police Chief or the chief's designee shall attend Board meetings to serve as an informational resource for the Board. The Board shall provide an opportunity for public comment at each monthly meeting. The Board shall meet semi-annually with the chief of police to discuss issues of concern and to recommend ways that the police can improve their relationship with citizens. The Board may also make recommendations regarding policies, rules, hiring, training and the complaint process.
- (3) Four (4) members shall constitute a quorum for conducting business.
- (4) The Board may establish rules and procedures that do not conflict with this code or the rules and regulations governing internal affairs investigations.
 - (5) Board members shall follow the National Association for Civilian Oversight of Law Enforcement (NACOLE) Code of Ethics.
 - (6) All closed records provided to the Board shall remain a closed record and shall be returned to the City before adjourning any meeting.

98 E. Administration and training.

- (1) The Chief of Police shall be the designated staff liaison for the Board, and a City staff member shall be provided to the Board to perform administrative duties, including providing information to the Board and keeping minutes of the meetings of the Board.
- (2) An independent contractor that demonstrates knowledge of issues pertaining to civil rights, the criminal justice system and the police practices may be employed part-time to serve as a "Coordinator" to assist the Board in the preparation of the required reports and the preparation of recommendations to the Police Chief. The Coordinator may also assist in training of the Board members. The Coordinator shall be hired by the Mayor and shall not be a voting member of the Board.
- (3) New Board members shall participate in orientation and training that includes review of the police professional standard unit's operating policies and procedures and a ridealong with police officers. Training shall also include topics suggested by NACOLE in its recommended orientation and training for Board members.
- (4) After an appointment to the Board but before serving on the Board, Board members

 - (5) The Board shall promptly meet to conduct its review and shall make a determination within ninety (90) days of its receipt of the written request. If the Board does not act within ninety (90) days of its receipt of the written request for jurisdictional review, the decision of the Police Chief shall be deemed to be affirmed.
 - (6) If the Board agrees with the Police Chief's determination, the Board shall notify the Police Chief, the police officer or employee of the police department, and the complainant of its determination. If the Board disagrees with the Police Chief and finds that the complainant has timely filed a complaint alleging misconduct, the Board shall notify the Police Chief, the police officer or the employee of the police department and the complainant. The Police Chief shall proceed with an investigation of the complaint.

J. Board review of Police Chief's decision on complaints and recommendation.

- (1) The Board shall review all of the Police Chief's decisions on complaints when an appeal is filed in accordance with Section 8 of this Article. In so doing, the Board shall review the record of the investigation, including but not limited to, any and all recorded, unedited interviews.
- (2) The Board, as part of its review, may hear comments from the complainant, witnesses to the incident and police officers if such persons request that the Board do so.
- (3) The Police Chief and all police officers shall cooperate with the Board in its review of the Police Chief's decision, but cooperation does not require a police officer or a witness to testify or make any statements to the Board.

(4) As part of the Board's review, the Board shall have the authority to request police department records pertaining to the complaint and the investigation of the complaint, and the Police Chief shall respond to the Board's request for records within five (5) days by providing such documents or by providing a written explanation to the Board and the Mayor detailing the reasons why the documents will not be produced. In the event the Police Chief does not produce the records requested by the Board, the Board has the power and authority to seek the issuance of a subpoena from a Judge within the Twenty-First (21st) Judicial Circuit.

- (5) Any person who voluntarily appears before the Board shall be entitled to have an attorney or representative present with them.
- (6) The Board shall provide timely updates on the progress of the review to the complainant and the police officer or employee of the police department, unless the specific facts of the review would prohibit such updates or the documentation or information is a closed record under Chapter 610, R.S.Mo.
- (7) The Board may decline further action on its review of the decision of the Police Chief if it determines that the alleged acts of misconduct are false.
- (8) The Board may request the Police Chief to order further investigation.
- (9) After completing its review, the Board shall report its findings and recommendations to the Mayor, the Police Chief, the police officer or the employee of the police department and the complainant to the extent that the information in its findings and recommendations are not closed records under Chapter 610, R.S.Mo.
- (10) If the Board agrees with the Police Chief's decision, it shall give notice to the police officer or the employee of the police department and the complainant that they have the right to appeal the chief's decision as provided in Section 11.
- (11) If the Board recommends a disposition of the complaint other than the decision made by the Police Chief, the Police Chief shall have ten (10) business days to reconsider the original decision and either reaffirm or modify it. The Police Chief shall give written notice of the decision to the Board, the Mayor, the police officer or the employee of the police department, and the complainant to the extent that the information in his decision are not closed records under Chapter 610, R.S.Mo. The Police Chief shall also give notice to the police officer or the employee of the police department and the complainant that they have the right to appeal the Police Chief's decision as provided for in Section 11 or in Chapter 125, Article V, of the Florissant Code. If the Police Chief takes no action within ten (10) business days after the date of the Board's findings and recommendation, the original decision of the Police Chief is automatically reaffirmed and the Board shall give notice to the police officer, the employee of the police department and the complainant that they have the right to appeal the Police Chief's decision as provided for in Section 11 or in Chapter 125,

- K. Appeals to the Mayor and Personnel Commission. After the Board's findings and recommendation or, if applicable, the Police Chief's decision after reconsideration, the police officer or the employee of the police department and the complainant shall have the right to appeal as follows:
 - (1) The police officer or employee of the police department may appeal the Police Chief's decision to the Personnel Commission in accordance with Chapter 125, Article V, of the Florissant Code if the officer or employee of the police department was suspended, demoted or discharged. The appeal shall be made by filing a written request with the city clerk for a hearing before the Personnel Commission. The request shall set forth the employee's grievance and reasons for appeal. The request must be filed within twenty-one (21) days after the officer or employee of the police department was given notice of the right to appeal. The hearing shall be held in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 125, Article V, of the Florissant Code. At the hearing, the complainant shall be allowed to testify to the facts of the incident and shall be allowed to express an opinion on the appropriate Personnel Commission action.
 - (2) The police officer or employee of the police department may appeal the Police Chief's decision to the Mayor if the discipline was other than suspension, demotion or discharge. The appeal shall be made by filing a written statement with the Mayor setting forth the employee's reasons for appeal. The request must be filed within twenty-one (21) days after receiving the notice of the right to appeal. The appeal shall be handled in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 125, Article V, of the Florissant Code. The Mayor shall give notice of the appeal to the complainant and afford the complainant the opportunity to discuss the matter with the Mayor.
 - The complainant may appeal the Police Chief's decision to the Mayor. The appeal (3) shall be made by filing a written statement with the Mayor explaining the reasons for The request must be filed within twenty-one (21) days after the complainant was given notice of the right to appeal. The Mayor shall give notice of the appeal to the police officer or employee of the police department. The police officer or employee of the police department shall have fourteen (14) days after notice has been given to file a written response to the complainant's appeal with the Mayor. The police officer, the employee of the police department and the complainant shall not otherwise communicate with the Mayor concerning the complaint. If the employee has also appealed, the procedures of subsection (a) or (b) shall be followed. If the employee has not appealed, and the Mayor determines that the alleged facts merit more severe discipline involving the suspension, demotion or discharge of the police officer or employee of the police department, the employee may appeal the Mayor's decision to the Personnel Commission for a hearing following the procedures set forth in Chapter 125, Article V, of the Florissant Code. Otherwise, the Mayor may act on the appeal as the Mayor deems appropriate.

335 L. *Open records and meetings*.

- Notwithstanding the provisions set forth herein, all records pertaining to complaints filed against police officers or employee of the police department alleging misconduct of the police officer or employee of the police department shall be closed records in accordance with Chapter 610, R.S.Mo.
- 340 (2) The Board shall meet in open session except as provided in (c).
- The Board shall meet in closed session to hear statements, discuss and investigate matters:
 - (a) That cannot be heard or discussed in an open meeting under state or federal law; or
 - (b) That involve the review of an appeal as provided for in <u>Section 10</u>;
 - (c) That would involve disclosure of the identity of an officer working undercover.
- M. *Obstructing Board operations*. It shall be unlawful for any person, in any manner, to willfully intimidate, influence, impede, deter, threaten, harass, obstruct or prevent another person from freely, fully and truthfully cooperating with the Board.
- N. Annual evaluation by council. Each year, after reviewing the Board's annual report, the city council shall review the effectiveness of the Board and shall determine whether this article should be modified or repealed.
- O. **Availability of police policies**. In accordance with Chapter 610, R.S.Mo. (commonly referred to as the "Sunshine Law"), the Police Chief shall make available to the city council, employees and the general public, upon request, all police department policies, guidelines, directives, orders, rules and regulations except those that would reveal tactics that would endanger the life of any police officer or would otherwise be a closed record under Chapter 610, R.S.Mo.

WHEREAS, the City Council feels that a constant speed of no higher than 35 should be imposed on Howdershell Road; and
